ConocoPhillips Canada Centennial Scholarship Program

The Centennial Scholarship program is a post secondary awards program comprised of up to eight awards annually valued at up to \$10,000 each. The spirit and intention of the awards are to support young Canadian visionaries who have a drive to make a difference in Canada's future. Therefore, the program is targeted at individuals who have demonstrated academic excellence, leadership, and community involvement.

The full scholarship program was launched in 2007 with one scholarship awarded annually to children of employees who are attending full time studies at a Canadian Post Secondary Institution.

Aboriginal Education and Post Secondary Awards Program

The ConocoPhillips Aboriginal Awards Program provides financial assistance to Aboriginal students pursuing high school upgrading and post-secondary education. Award amounts are designated to the level the applicant is pursuing: \$1,000 for secondary school/academic upgrading, \$2,000 for college or technical institute and \$3,000 for university. The ConocoPhillips Trades Bursary Program annually awards up to 13 trade students with up to \$2500 toward tuition, books and living expenses. STARS air ambulance

The Alberta Shock Trauma Air Rescue Society (STARS) is a non-profit charitable organization that began operating in 1985. It is dedicated to the safe, rapid, highly specialized emergency medical transport system for the critically ill and injured.

Capable of servicing communities within a 250-kilometre radius of Calgary, Edmonton and Grande Prairie, STARS helicopters can fly in and perform rescues in approximately 90 per cent of Alberta and many communities in southeastern and northeastern British Columbia. This means STARS helicopters can fly in many of the ConocoPhillips operating areas.
